

Lancashire County Senior Ladies Golf Association Minutes of the Annual General Meeting Friday 3rd December 2021 Pleasington Golf Club

1. Apologies

There were 48 apologies including apologies from Captain and President.

2. Approval of minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 4th December 2019.

The minutes were published on the Association website and taken as read along with a Finance and Membership report. No meeting was held in 2020, due to the Covid restrictions in place at the time.

3. Hon. Treasurer's Report and Approval of accounts.

Mrs Christine Entwistle (Secretary) read out a detailed Finance Report on behalf of Jane Rogers, Treasurer.

Jane took on the job of Treasurer in June 2021 when Sheila Whamond, the then Treasurer, had to retire on the grounds of ill health. Jane thanked Sheila for her support and also Maggie Ayers. Jane pointed out that she is currently caretaker Treasurer and will continue to do the job for 2022. If anyone is interested in the role or knows of someone who may be, then they should contact the Association via the Association Secretary. Jane indicated that because of the uncertainty in the world in January, the Committee had no idea how 2021 would roll out and therefore both our Association and the Northern Veteran Ladies Golf Association made a number of decisions to safeguard members and finances which has resulted in a large surplus for the first time in many years. The surplus is explained in the accounts by comparing 2021 in most cases to 2019, as 2020 had no income.

Decisions made:

- 1. The decision by the six Northern Counties to have no caddies for the Richardson Trophy matches.
- 2. The match against Welsh Northern Counties was cancelled for 2021.
- 3. Finally, the match against Durham was forfeited by Durham because they refused to travel to Lancashire in early June.These 3 actions and the reduction in mileage allowance for the team and officials at Richardson Trophy matches led to a saving in expenses of £3545 over 2019.
- 4. Membership income was £5234, an increase of £360 over 2019.

- All meetings in 2021 were conducted by zoom, which made a further saving of just under £500, and there was no AGM in December 2020, saving a further £491.
- 6. The income from events, excluding the Championship increased from 2019 by £944 as almost all of them, apart from the Silver Slipper and the Cecil Leitch were fully subscribed. The facility fees paid to golf clubs to run the Association's Competitions increased in the last few years and therefore it was necessary to raise the entry fee for the Championship as this had not been increased since 2010. The field for the Championship was virtually full and the income increased from 2019 by £620.

The total savings over 2019, therefore, from the measures taken amounted to £6453.

New software from Club Systems was introduced to run competitions which cost £624. This was a one-off cost without an annual maintenance cost.

The total surplus for 2021 was £5455. This reverses the deficits for the years 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020, but Jane's forecast for 2022 is that we will again be in deficit because, whilst certain of the measures we took at the beginning of 2021 will be continued, the overall pattern of expenditure will be similar to 2019.

Finally Jane thanked Robert Hynes for again undertaking to audit the accounts for the Association.

4. Captain's Report

Past Captain, Mrs Diana Cockerill, read out a report on behalf of Captain.

2021 was a year when we had to react to whatever Covid 19 gave us. It certainly gave us a new vocabulary and a lot of extra work.

The Captains of the six Northern counties agreed to no caddies in the Northern Vets Championship and the Richardson Trophy Matches. Casualties of Covid and Social distancing. Also, instead of having the NCVLGA Business Meeting inside the Bishop Auckland clubhouse, on the practice day of the Northern, we held it by Zoom the week before. It went well, so this change will probably continue in 2022.

To reduce the risk of infections, our own Championship was switched from April to September and instead we managed to fit in the B team match on April 25th at Royal Birkdale. It was a wonderful sunny day but the differences in the handicaps were too hard for us to handle.

It had been agreed to cancel the match against the Welsh Northern Counties but this is to be rearranged for 2022. In an attempt to fill the gap left by not having the Championship in April and no meaningful practice matches we tried to arrange some matchplay games at FLGC.

The Northern Foursomes was at Bromborough and a few of our members acquitted themselves well. The eventual winners are both members - Jan Keelan and Sarah Meehan. They won the final at the 3rd extra hole – very well done.

In the Northern Vets Championship at Bishop Auckland Clare MacLeod, Harwood and Sharon Eales, Royal Birkdale both qualified in the first flight. This is a great achievement with the standards nowadays. Clare lost in the morning, Sharon won in the morning but ran out of steam in the afternoon. Susan Caton, Pleasington, lost in the first round of the second flight but to the eventual winner. Maybe there will be more from Lancashire entering next year at Penrith. Sharon was selected for her first Jamboree Team playing at Glenbervie. She couldn't believe the standard of the golf nor the agony of losing out by half a point after 3 days of matchplay.

Our 2021 Richardson Trophy Matches

For our 3 away matches we tried to keep the squad in "our own bubble" by staying in Premier Inns and eating all our meals at the clubhouses. This did involve a lot more organisation but it was worth it in the end. For all our matches the rain stayed awaybut perhaps our players needed more assistance from the elements.

Our first match was on May 26th against Cumbria at Silloth on Solway. Silloth is a marvellous course and with a few blind greens and doglegs, it takes a good bit of knowing. We could have won, we could have lost but in the end it was a draw. It's very good not to lose away and we had our first home fixture against Durham to look forward to. Our second match should have been at Formby Ladies on Saturday June 5th but Durham felt that Covid cases in Sefton were too high for them to fulfil the fixture. Lancashire were denied the comfort of a home match which I think affected the confidence of some of the squad. Durham wanted to play in August but there were no suitable dates free so they had to forfeit the match.

Our third match was at Oakdale, Harrogate on June 22nd. Designed by Alister Mac-Kenzie with sloping fairways and tricky greens this was a difficult course to master. Yorkshire showed that a little more knowledge helps immensely. The team tried hard but lost. Our fourth and final match was against Cheshire at Wilmslow on Monday July 19th and this was a very tight match. We lost 2 games on the 17th and another on the 18th. All these could have gone our way for a victory but sadly we lost again.

All our Team Events have been well supported and the results all posted to the website. It's great to see the wide spread of clubs represented in the timesheet and also the range of winners. This year we had some octogenarians going home with first prizes.

The full Championship Report is also on the website.

We installed new software in May from Club Systems, which has aided the registration process and closing the competitions. We intend to develop the use of this software further in 2022, we will start with online payments for subscriptions and then entries for the Championship. Moving slowly and monitoring the benefits of embracing new technology at each new step.

Mrs Linda Dorning of Preston GC was installed as President of the North at their AGM on October 6th. I have no doubt all of our members wish her success in her new role and a lot of laughs along the way. I'm sure you will guide the Northern Committee in your usual light hearted but firm manner. Congratulations Linda.

My sincere thanks must go to Christine Entwistle for continually keeping me on the right track. Her assistance has been invaluable to me. I wish I had her organisational skills. Without an AGM last year, it was agreed that Sheila Whamond would take over the Treasurer's role. Sadly, in the summertime Sheila had to retire on the grounds of ill health.Prior to taking on the Treasurer's role, Sheila had been Membership Secretary for 5 years. The Association has benefited greatly from her management skills as she oversaw the implementation of the new membership system 4 years ago. Thank you Sheila for all your efforts and we all wish you a speedy recovery and a long retirement. Thanks must also go to our President because she stepped into the breach in Sheila's absence. Jane took over both the Treasurer's function and the position of Membership Secretary until replacements could be found. President has also over-seen the implementation of the new software while continuing to upgrade our existing

Puma Seniors software which is crucial to the fair running of the annual ballot for all our team events. Sincere thanks Jane for all those long hours you've spent on the phone and online to Puma and to Club Systems plus handling membership queries and keeping our accounts in order. Jane's also been there at the first tee and around the course offering positive encouragement to all our team players. To those who thought our President was just a technology guru please don't forget she played in 3 Jamborees.

I have thanked all the other Committee members and squad players on an individual basis. All that remains is for me to say to all our members, many thanks for making this such a memorable year. Thanks go especially to Formby Ladies who bent over backwards to display " a can do attitude " with everything we asked for in 2021. Apart from the Championship, all our other events & matches were blessed with good weather. We've enjoyed playing a great variety of courses and we must thank all the clubs for their hard work, in such unprecedented conditions, to make us feel so welcome. Let me take this opportunity to wish that you stay healthy throughout the coming winter and to have good golfing in 2022.

To finish, I must say what an honour it has been to be Captain and to wish Carmel, Chris and Jen all the very best for 2022.
