Janet Melville won the best gross and the President's Prize with a gross 80 and the next best gross was 84 from Tracey Bentley, Carmel Hall and Jane Rogers.

The weather for the matchplay stages became windier and windier and colder and colder, with some exciting matches both morning and afternoon on the Monday. In the semi finals Janet played Jane Rogers, and played superbly to win 6&5. Helen played Tracey Bentley and they had a humdinger of a match, going to the 19th where Helen closed out her opponent. The final was very exciting, with Helen striking the

first blow by winning the first hole. Janet levelled the score at the par 3 5th, and looked as if she might go 1 up at the 6th, but her putt slipped by.

By the time the players reached the 11th Janet was 3 up, but anything can happen on the back nine, and Helen holed a good putt to go back to 2 down. The girls exchanged holes on the 12th and 13th so Janet was still 2 up on the 14th. Janet hit an immaculate second just short of the green and this was good enough to win the hole and make Janet dormy three up. Both girls hit tee shots right of centre and into the semi rough, and both girls hit very good second shots, but it was advantage Janet, as she put her second just short of the green, and ultimately it was Janet's Championship.
